

May Guest Speaker ■ Ted Blackall

At our last general meeting we had a lot of fun watching Ted Blackall paint Collaroy Headland. Describing himself as an abstract expressionist, he purposefully works quickly, painting in acrylics. He often paints en plein air, adding glazes in oil in the studio later.

Ted outlined his 6 steps to a great painting. Briefly these were:

- Think about the reason you paint the real prize being to "get into the moment" and being at peace with everything - not for money!
- Circumvent the ego when painting, ie don't judge the painting while it is underway, (as explained by Betty Edwards in her book Drawing on the Right Side of the Brain.
- The painting should also work upside down. His paintings are organized by tonal mass and he often finishes his work upside down so he can appreciate the abstract in the picture.
- The big bang usually the thing in the light which carries the main part of the picture. Ted places the most contrast between light and dark at this point and it is always displaced from the centre.
- Colour quoting Roy de Maistre on colour, Ted likes to harmonise his work and put it in a particular tonal key.
- Tonal differences. Ted suggests that if we scan or photograph our work to put it on to the computer, then view it in black and white - it should work just as well, i.e. without colour.

When painting Ted showed us where he was looking at on the canvas – and invariably it was not where he was painting. Usually he was looking a little higher and to the right and so keep the spot where he was painting in his peripheral vision.

"If you look away, your eye is averted to a different place and it helps you to apply the right amount of pressure and colour because you have to feel it."

He also likes to stand back and tilt his head to one side so that he can see the whole picture at once in his peripheral vision.

As Ted said "Try it!"

Spread out on the table were numerous plastic plates each holding a different colour, and on the floor two big buckets of water for rinsing brushes. It seemed to be organized chaos - but out of the melee emerged a wonderful landscape depicting Collaroy headland.


We are hoping to arrange for Ted to take a workshop for us later in the year, so look out for that

June Vince Vozzo

Sculptor and Artist



Vince Vozzo was born in Sydney in 1954 and studied art at Liverpool TAFE, East Sydney College and Alexander Mackie College of Advanced Education.

In a career spanning three decades. Vozzo has exhibited in 32 solo exhibitions and produced thousands of artworks in different mediums. He has featured in numerous group exhibitions, most notably Sydney's Sculpture by the Sea, where his magnificent sculpture has loomed large over the coastal horizon more than 13 times to date. His work has been included in 36 prize exhibitions and with eight selections in the prestigious Wynne Prize, Vozzo holds the record for a sculptor in that competition. He has been the recipient of numerous awards and commissions most notably the Ligurian Society Art Travel Scholarship to Pietrasanta, Italy and the Norton Sculpture Award.

Vozzo's work is represented in private and public collections in Australia, Europe, USA and Asia. His work has received widespread media coverage, including in McCulloch's Encyclopaedia of Australian Art, the Australian Mildura Sculpture Triennial and the Australian Art Review. Vince's work has also been seen on the small screen, including a sand scuplture that he created for Robert Hughes' The Fatal Shore which aired on SBS and the BBC.

Greg Hansell13 May 2017

Our May workshop was with Greg Hansell. We worked with pastels on a still life indoors, then after lunch moved outside into the sunshine for some more demonstrations and plein air pastel work.

Greg showed us his style of pastel painting, and gave us some tips on method, colour, tone, line and composition. Start in the distance of a painting and work forwards toward the foreground; juxtaposition of light and shade, colour theory and perspective. Greg demonstrated his Earth Pastels which he makes himself from ground down rock, which come in an amazing range of tones and colours.



Nafisa Naomi 17 June 2017

We are so lucky to have Nafisa Naomi come to teach us how to draw fabulous animals. She is a vibrant and energetic person who produces WOW pictures!

Nafisa will teach us how to draw our wonderful furry and feathered friends - elephants, rhinos, tigers and orang-utans. She will bring her photos of these exotic animals, and she suggests we also bring some of our own photos of domestic and farm animals, which can be endearing and great subjects as well.

The primary focus will be on drawing, including the anatomy of the animal.



Nafisa is totally committed to creating works that celebrate the beauty of this fragile world. She has been represented in every major art prize and in 2010 won the Archibald Packers prize and first prize for painting in the Florence Biennale in 2007. She has also been a finalist in the Dobell Drawing Prize, Portia Geach Portrait prize, the Blake Prize and the Shirley Hannan Portrait prize amongst others.



Materials:

Bring along whatever materials you like to draw with - pencils, charcoal, pastels, even oils and collage, and of course appropriate supports for those materials. Pastels are good as they achieve the best results with wildlife portraits when describing fur.


